- **Choose from a wide range of courses in the arts, humanities and sciences** Students will choose an additional 2-3 courses in their major or minor.

## Honors at the University of Glasgow

### Unique Opportunity to Study Abroad in Scotland

The Principia Program offers the opportunity to study in Scotland in conjunction with the University of Glasgow. The University was founded in 1451 and is an internationally recognized institution with prestigious programs in the sciences and humanities.

The Honors semester at the University of Glasgow will allow you to

### 1. Complete an Honors course elective: "The Ideas & Influences of the Scottish Enlightenment"

The University of Glasgow is an internationally renowned institution with a strong intellectual history. In the 18th century, Glasgow was at the centre of the Enlightenment and home to world-famous figures like Adam Smith. This course will introduce you to the cultural and intellectual life of Scotland during the Enlightenment and its lasting influence on world culture and contemporary thought.

This is an interdisciplinary course in which leading scholars will expose Honors at Glasgow students to the groundbreaking ideas of the Scottish Enlightenment and their impact on fields as varied as art and aesthetics, politics and economics, science and medicine, philosophy, and religion.

Included in the course program are opportunities to visit other Scottish historic centers, such as the city of Edinburgh.

### 2. Take an additional 2-3 courses in your major or minor

The University of Glasgow has both breadth and depth in most undergraduate majors. Science, pre-med, and pre-vet Honors students will have access to a sophisticated range of disciplines and courses. Fine and liberal arts majors, as well as business will have an exciting variety of course options.

All Honors at Glasgow students will have access to level 3 and some level 4 courses not usually available to other study abroad students.

### 3. Enjoy more opportunities for Honors at Glasgow

- Special cultural immersion events for Honors students inside and outside the classroom
- Possibility of service learning or internships
- Meeting some of the 3,000 other international students from 24 countries
- Meeting Honors students from our consortium member institutions in the U.S.
- Travel in the U.K. and the continental Europe.
