A LETTER

from Alumni Association Board President



Dear Converse Alumni,

As I conclude my term as your Alumni Association Board (AAB) President, I am more encouraged by the state of our alma mater than ever before. Our future is bright and that is because our beloved institution is strong. A couple months ago, I had the privilege of speaking at the Class of 2020 in-person commencement. When I stepped onto campus that morning, it was a brisk fall morning similar to so many mornings I walked out of my dorm to trek to Gee Dining Hall for breakfast. I walked under Wilson Tower, into the lobby, and in front of the rows of Honor Code Pledges. Professors lined the hallway and there was a buzz in the air. That same excitement of a commencement, a year and a half after it was due. What thrilled me that morning was

the sameness of place. The same honor code, the same friendly faculty, and the same Converse we know and love. While many things are different at Converse, I am most encouraged that the college is not going anywhere. We are co-ed, we are a university, and most importantly, we are poised to weather any storm the future may bring.

I began my term June 6, 2020. COVID had entered our lives three months prior. The nation was protesting George Floyd's killing, and many of us began reflecting on systemic racism as well as the racism in our own hearts. After a period of listening and learning, our Alumni Association Board needed to move to action. We connected with alumni of color, and reached out to other colleges to see how they were supporting alumni. We kept circling back to the word "belonging." This was no revelation as all people want a place they belong. However, Converse was falling short on inclusivity. We then created the Diversity Equity and Inclusion Committee (DEIC) as a permanent working group who are determined to create, support, and sustain alumni communities that reflect the diversity of our alumni population reinforcing a mutual respect for each other and a sense of belonging and purpose within our collective Converse community. Specifically, this group will spearhead mentorship with alumni and current students as well as special events focused on diversity.

Despite the challenges of COVID, I am proud to say we have continued to support the Admissions team as they achieved their highest year of undergraduate enrollment in 30 years. We awarded many deserving Alumni Achievement Awards with a virtual ceremony for recognition of an outstanding group

of accomplished alumni. Our Connecting Alumni to Converse Committee (CAC), formerly known as the TAPP committee, has been supporting events virtually and now in person to engage local chapters to reunite.

As I conclude my time on the AAB, I hope to leave a group of engaged alumni who are excited about this chapter in Converse's history. We usher in a new era, with new traditions, and with a long memory of all that came before us. There are so many opportunities to serve Converse both near Spartanburg or in your own hometown. I hope the work of this Board can inspire others to do something as easy as nominate a fellow alumnus for

an award or even consider serving alongside us on this Board. The many students following behind us at Converse today will soon join our ranks and I hope that we can welcome them with open arms into a community that is vibrant and active.

Why did you decide to attend Converse, and what stands out about your experience?

When it was time to choose a college, I knew I wanted to eventually teach music in some form, whether as a K-12 educator or as a church musician. Converse's excellent music school was a big consideration for me along with Furman and the University of South Carolina. My Dad, a Wofford grad who met my mother while she was at Converse, believed in the advantages of a small school and certainly believed in Converse! I found that to be true with not only the small class sizes but also with the professors who knew you by name and would even invite you into their homes. The camaraderie within the music school and the opportunity to dine together in Gee every evening were things I still treasure and would likely not have enjoyed at larger schools. As a music student at Converse, I realized my weaknesses and limitations but I was also able to embrace my strengths. I found a sense of belonging within the music school.

What aspect of volunteering for Converse do you find most rewarding?

When my husband and I moved with our two children from Northeastern NC to the Charlotte area in 2002, the shorter distance to Spartanburg allowed me to become more engaged at Converse. I volunteered to be a member of the Alumnae Board after my mother's death in 2015 with the hope of representing the both

of us in giving back to our alma mater in meaningful ways. I have gladly served as the Giving Officer for the Board with the intention of reminding all alumni that our annual gifts strengthen our alma mater in so many ways that include helping ALL students who wish to attend Converse realize that opportunity, and in raising the status of our own education and diploma. Also, I am proud to serve on the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) committee alongside other alumni hoping to create mentorship opportunities for fellow alumni and nurturing a sense of belonging within the alumni community. As President-Elect of the Alumni Board, I am excited to witness the changing status of Converse and the consequential growth in size, diversity, and opportunities.

As the former Alumni Association Board Giving Officer, why do you feel it's important to give back to Converse?

My husband has worked in college development for almost 40 years making it possible for many disadvantaged students to attend college without the burden of financial responsibilities. My daughter now works in admissions in a large state university hoping to make it possible for all students who wish for a college education to realize that dream despite economic status. Understanding the difference financial support can make to an institution and to individuals, we have always been faithful in giving what we can to our church and to higher education. The Converse Annual Fund is managed so well, distributing funds to programs and needs that make a difference. If we could all as alumni understand and embrace the power in giving (any amount) regularly to our alma mater, the possibilities would be endless.

What does the Converse community mean to you as an alumna?

I have never ceased to be proud of my Converse education. It was the right place for me at that time. Change is inevitable within any institution. The

changes proposed for and occurring at Converse are, in my opinion, changes in the right direction and for the right reasons. Our individual experiences while at Converse will always be a part of us. My hope is that all alumni, regardless of age or class year, will come together in the spirit of understanding and cheer each other on, creating a community of alumni who share the bond of the Converse experience.

What excites you most about serving as the 2022-2023 President of the Alumni Association Board?

It is a very exciting time for Converse University! I am honored and privileged to be involved in the Alumni Board during the search for a new president, as we launch into University status, and as we grow into a more diverse and inclusive community. I think the biggest challenge and yet one of the most important goals we will embrace as the Alumni Board is successfully bridging alumni of all ages, backgrounds, and disciplines into a community of alumni who proudly share the bond of a Converse education.

Do you have a favorite Converse memory?

As a member of the Converse Chorale all four years of my time at Converse, the Festival of Lessons and Carols service was an annual highlight. My parents always attended and we all looked forward to that time on campus when luminaries lined the entrance drive and Wilson was decorated so beautifully. We had an incredible chorus of voices at that time and it was a thrill for me to be even a small part of such a group. As a future choral director, I learned so much from the directors, Perry Daniels and Larry Smith.

Are there any fun facts we should know about you?

I guess it's somewhat ironic that I have always loved college football even though I chose to attend a college with neither a football team nor males.



UPDATE Converse College for Women



This fall, the Converse College for Women (CCW) officially launched its empowering living-learning community with meaningful traditions, new programming and events, and community service.

Big Sis/Little Sis week was a dynamic opportunity to welcome new students into the sisterhood and kick-off the new term. Thanks to Converse's powerful alumni connection, the Women's College received many Big Sis/Little Sis donations that enhanced this time-honored tradition.

In September, students in the Women's College watched and discussed the National Women's History Museum's live-streamed symposium "The Missing Waves of Feminism: The Third Wave" as part of

the organization's 25th anniversary. Following the symposium, CCW students engaged in a conversation on women changemakers beyond the "canonical" 1980-2010 period that is often referred to as the "third wave of feminism." This discussion was led by Assistant Dean of Diversity & Inclusion, Danielle Stone, and Assistant Professor of English, Dr. Emily Harbin.

The Women's College hosted its first annual Fall Retreat in October that included sessions on women's wellness and yoga, personal statements and professionalism, and the power of goal-setting and personal journaling. The day-long retreat was led by four alumni who shared their passion and talents with current Women's College students, illuminating once again the strength of the Converse network.



Focusing on service for the month of November, students joined the Period Project's Spartanburg Chapter, led by alumna Kerry Easler '96, to benefit girls at Spartanburg High School in need of support. Students donated the items and then gathered on a Sunday evening to stuff more than 375 period packs, and to discuss the importance of access and healthcare for all women and girls in our on and off-campus communities.

Along with the College's focus on service, traditions, and leadership, is the intentional study of the

representation and experiences of women. Dynamic new programs have been added to the growing list of CCW courses including Dr. Erin Templeton's English course, Women Writing, Women Talking, and the upcoming January Term course, Disney's America: History & Performance team-taught by Dr. Angela Elder and Dr. Chandra Owenby Hopkins. These courses deepen the connections between the academic and personal growth of students enrolled in the Converse College for Women and offer all Converse University students the opportunity to learn more deeply about the contributions of women writers, artists, and thinkers.

As the first half of the academic year was warmly wrapped up with a Cookies and Connections social at the Log Cabin, Converse celebrated the tremendous launch of the Women's College. With more than 135 years of sisterhood fueling the College's momentum, it's clear that the Converse College for Women will continue to be a transformative experience for its students as it looks excitedly towards the future.

Fun Flashback!

Did you know that Cudd Hall was formerly the Gwyn School, a preparatory school for girls? The building was purchased by Converse in the early 1900s and transformed into a residence hall. It was named Cudd Memorial Hall in memory of Allene Cudd Cantrell '12, who was the daughter of Converse Trustee John Cudd, cousin of Mary Sue Cudd '27 and Perrin Cudd Eidson '31.

Once the beloved site of the annual senior class photo, Cudd is quintessential Converse. Its distinctive Southern architecture has made for a cozy home-away-from-home for generations of Converse's upperclassmen. Cudd Hall is currently unable to operate at full capacity until further critical renovations are made. Stay tuned for ways you can help bring Cudd Hall back to her former glory!
