Boone J. Hopkins, Ph.D. was announced as the twelfth president of Converse on February 25, 2022 by the Converse University Board of Trustees. Dr. Hopkins has been a dedicated member of the Converse community since 2012.

Originally from Gainesville, Georgia, Dr. Hopkins is a proud Red Elephant from Gainesville High School. He experienced an innovative undergraduate liberal-arts education through a unique partnership between Brenau University, a historic women's college, and Gainesville State

College, a two-year state institution now known as the University of North Georgia. After completing a bachelor's degree, Dr. Hopkins received his MFA in Directing and Acting Pedagogy from Virginia Commonwealth University followed by a Ph.D. in Theatre Studies from the University of Kansas. Dr. Hopkins moved to Spartanburg in 2012 to join Converse as an Assistant Professor of Theatre. In addition to directing plays and musicals at Converse including *Legally Blonde: the Musical, Twelfth Night, Cabaret, The Wolves,* and *Godspell,* Dr. Hopkins has served in numerous leadership capacities including: Chair of the Department of Theatre & Dance, Dean of the School of the Arts, Senior Associate Provost for Student Success, Interim Provost, and Interim President.

Dr. Hopkins delights in helping those with whom he collaborates reach new heights and achieve excellence. In parallel with his leadership work for Converse, Dr. Hopkins brings his love of empowering others and impacting his community for good through his work in Spartanburg on the Board of the Chapman Cultural Center, as a member of the Ten at the Top Board to support economic development in the Upstate, and as a member of the Integrated Planning Advisory Group for the Spartanburg Academic Movement. Dr. Hopkins is a member of Trinity United Methodist Church and serves as an assistant basketball coach for the Advent Episcopal first and second grade teams.

President Hopkins is married to Dr. Chandra Owenby Hopkins, Dean of the Converse College for Women, and they have two children: Owen (9) and Jack (7).

Poet Rick Mulkey directs the Bachelor of Fine Arts program in Creative and Professional Writing at Converse University as well as the University's Master of Fine Arts program in Creative Writing. Professor Mulkey wrote *The Gardener* in January 2023, in celebration of Boone Hopkins' inauguration as Converse's 12th President. In February 2023, Professors of Music Dr. David Berry and Dr. Scott Robbins both used *The Gardener* as inspiration for their short piano pieces, titled *Flowering Trumpets* and *Life Toward Light* respectively. Today the poem will be read by Jenna Elser, Instructor of Theatre, and the two pieces will be performed by Dr. Steven Graff, Assistant Professor of Piano.

THE CONVERSE MACE

The Converse Mace represents the governing authority of the University and the link between the president and the faculty. It is borne by the Grand Marshal, who leads the academic procession. Designed by Greg Mueller, former Assistant Professor of Sculpture, the mace is crafted of bronze and purple heart wood, with 12 spiral elements bearing the names of the academic departments. While not in procession, the mace rests on a stand adorned with the Converse seal and the Founder's Ideal to "See Clearly, Decide Wisely, Act Justly." The stand and spiral elements are made of reclaimed architectural millwork from Wilson Hall's original construction.

Each year, a faculty member is chosen to serve as Grand Marshal by the President from nominees solicited from all faculty. This high honor is based on outstanding teaching, professional accomplishments, service to Converse, and seniority.

THE PRESIDENT'S MEDALLION

Adorning the academic regalia of the Converse president is a medallion and chain designed and handmade by Mary Helen Garrison Dalton '46 in 2004. Boone Hopkins is the fourth president to wear the medallion, which incorporates cabochon amethyst and cabochon citrine with gold and silver links that bear the engraved name of each Converse president. Each presidential link within the chain symbolizes the strength of leadership that has sustained Converse throughout her history and will continue to propel her forward.

ふ Academic Regalia み

Traditional academic regalia is highly symbolic. Each piece of the formal ensemble indicates the wearer's academic achievements and rank. The style and cut of the gown indicate the wearer's highest degree. Bachelors' robes are cut with long, pointed sleeves, while masters' robes feature oblong slit sleeves that fall below the knee. Doctors' full-cut robes are distinguished by velvet front facings and full bell sleeves with velvet chevrons. Hoods are lined with the official color or colors of the college or university which granted the degree. The bordering color, as well as other gown trimmings and cap tassels, indicates the subject in which the degree was earned. For example, pink denotes music, gold denotes science, light blue denotes education, and purple denotes law.

Converse was founded in 1889 by citizens of Spartanburg, SC, who aimed to create an educational experience for women, and in fall 2020 it welcomed its first undergraduate co-educational incoming class.

"It is my conviction that the well-being of any country depends much upon the culture of her women, and I have done what I could to found a college that would provide for women thorough and liberal education, so that for them the highest motives may become clear purposes and fixed habits of life; and I desire that the instruction and influence of Converse College be always such that the students may be enabled to see clearly, decide wisely, and to act justly; and that they may learn to love God and humanity, and be faithful to truth and duty, so that their influence may be characterized by purity and power.

"It is also my desire and hope that Converse College be always truly religious, but never denominational. I believe that religion is essential to all that is purest and best in life, here and hereafter. I wish the College to be really, but liberally and tolerantly, Christian; for I believe that the revelation of God in Christ is for salvation; and I commend and commit the College to the love and guidance of God, and to the care, sympathy, and fidelity of my fellowmen."
