Despite personal losses, faculty and staff immediately stepped in to support our residential students.

In the days and weeks that followed, emergency responders and the Converse community worked side by side to restore campus and uplift one another.

The morale of our community triumphed as power was slowly restored and trees were removed from the grounds. By October 7, 2024, the campus officially reopened, resilient, united, and stronger than before.

From organizing drives for Valkyrie Supply and campus cleanup initiatives to hosting a pop-up art sale with a percentage of the sales going to hurricane victims, Converse stepped up and held steadfast to one of our seven core values— **community**.

### **CONVERSE RISES IN RANKINGS**


